A brief primer about Field Day

# Field Day Primer by Bill AE6J



Field Day is, as John (K6JRO) calls it, Christmas for Amateur Radio operators in the United States. It is the one weekend of the year where there are more HAMS on the air in the US than any other time of the year.

Field Day is always the fourth full weekend of June. The operational period begins at 11AM local, 1800UTC and runs for 24 hours. During this operational period, the goal is to make as many contacts as possible on the radio. Modes of operation are Voice (no repeater contacts), Morse Code, Digital (FT8, PSK31, RTTY), and Satellite. Operations are on the HF, VHF, and UHF Amateur Radio bands.

If you are interested in learning more about Amateur Radio, Field Day is the perfect opportunity for you. You will learn about various radios, antennas, portable power solutions (batteries and solar) and operating modes. You will have an opportunity to participate and get on the air and experience the voice and digital modes for yourself. All of our stations at the club event are open to other attendees trying them out. In addition to all the stations participating as our club stations, there will also be a GOTA station, a Get On The Air station for new licensees and unlicensed attendees to use. If you have any questions about radios, modes, antennas or anything else HAM radio related, you will have an abundance of experienced HAMS willing to share their knowledge with you.

The Stanislaus Amateur Radio Association, SARA, participates in the ARRL Field Day every year from a primitive campsite off of highway 4 above Dorrington. We camp in BLM (Bureau of Land Management) land. We will have porta-potties on-site and the club sponsors a pot-luck dinner on Saturday night of Field Day.

While operating radios is very important for the club on Field Day, it is also a major social event for the club. You can make Field Day weekend be whatever you are comfortable with.

When it comes to operating the radios at Field Day, you can spend most of your time operating and making contacts or you can spend no time doing it. Or any thing in between. It is all about what you are comfortable doing. Some people never touch a radio up at Field Day and some spend all their waking hours playing radio.

The Stanislaus County Amateur Radio Emergency Service is composed of FCC licensed Amateur Radio operators who have voluntarily registered their capabilities and equipment for public service communications duty under Federal regulations, Amateur Radio public service communications are furnished without any compensation of any kind. ARES® personnel are prepared to respond during emergencies by a continual training program, and by maintaining their radio equipment and other response items in excellent condition. The team consists only of those who want to help, and who are dedicated to staying prepared to render radiocommunications assistance during emergency conditions.

ARES® operates under the authority of the Stanislaus County Office of Emergency Services (OES), and the Stanislaus County Assistant Director for OES. ARES® is organized under the auspices of the American Radio Relay League, the San Joaquin Valley Section Manager, and the San Joaquin Valley Section District Emergency Coordinator. Operational control is under the Stanislaus county OES.

If you are interested in joining Stanislaus ARES go to the Stanislaus ARES website (<u>www.stanares.org</u>) and click on the Join ARES tab. There is formation on how to join and the membership forms to complete are available there. Please check in on the ARES voice radio net very Wednesday at 7:30 pm on the 145.390 – pl. 136.5 S.A.R.A. repeater. There is also an unproto Packet radio net during the voice net on 144.910 via the SARA node. The monthly training meeting is at 10:00am on the first Saturday of the month at 3705 Oakdale Road Modesto, CA. Meeting dates and times can change due to operational needs. Please check the web site for updates.

The next Stanislaus County ARES meeting will be **Saturday November 2, 2019** at 3705 Oakdale Road Modesto, CA. There will be ARES officer reports and a presentation on DMR radio and hot spots.

After the meeting those who will be participating in the hospital drill on November 7, 2019 will participate in winlink refresher training and exercise objectives will be discussed for the drill. Please bring your portable packet station for the training. Make sure you have checked and cleared your winlink messages before the meeting.

#### **ARRL EC-001 Emergency Communications Course**

If you need to take the ARRL Emergency Communications Course (EC-001) Stanislaus ARES can help. The EC-001 workbook is out of print, however The Indian River County ARES has all of the study information (including test and answers) posted on their web site. Recent amateurs who have taken the test have printed out the test questions and answers and have studied like they would for a ham cram. Pass rate has been about 100 percent.

Go to <u>www.ircares.org</u> This is the web site for the Indian River County ARES. Once you are on the web site click on the training and reference tab. Then click on the ARRL Introduction to Emergency Communications (EC-001) tab. That will take you to the course information.

Once you complete the on-line study you can arrange with Stanislaus ARES to take the ARRL test. We generally give the test at a ham cram session or before or after the monthly ARES meeting. # **Radio Programming Resources**

Here is a list of radio programming resources:

**Owner's Manual** 

 If you do not have your manual, check the manufacturer website. They may have it on line even if it is an older model. If not, check google. There are many websites where you can download a copy of your manual for free.

There are other paper resources also available. The Handheld Radio Field Guide has programming instructions for approximately 65 radios from all manufacturers. If you come across one that is not in the book but a similar radio is covered, it will probably get you on the right tract. Available on amazon, cost \$23.00. Nifty guides are available for many radios. You can get them from Amazon, DX engineering, ARRL and many other places. Cost varies 10.00-\$25.00.





Using programming software.

• This is a great way to fully program your radio with a big list of frequencies. There are many places to get the software. Many manufacturers have it on line for free. Some do charge.



RT systems: https://www.rtsystemsinc.com/. They make a quality product software and cables. Approximate cost is \$50.00 for both cable and software.



CHIRP is a free, open-source tool for programming your amateur radio. It supports a large number of manufacturers and models, as well as provides a way to interface with multiple data sources and formats. Chirp is a ham's dream come true. It is FREE.
