
The next ARES meeting will be June 5, 2021, and the training and will focus on ARES training and go boxes.





ARRL EC-001 course

ARRL EC-001 Emergency Communications Course

If you need to take the ARRL Emergency Communications Course (EC-001) Stanislaus ARES can help. The EC-001 workbook is out of print, however The Indian River County ARES has all of the study information (including test and answers) posted on their web site. Recent amateurs who have taken the test have printed out the test questions and answers and have studied like they would for a ham cram. Pass rate has been about 100 percent.

The ARRL has updated this course. There are some content differences, however members who have used this to prepare for the challenge exam have been successful.

Here is the web site to study for the ARRL Introduction to Emergency Communications Course challenge examination (EC-001):

Go to www.ircares.org This is the web site for the Indian River County ARES. Once you are on the web site click on the training and reference tab. Then click on the ARRL Introduction to Emergency Communications (EC-001) tab. That will take you to the course information.

Once you complete this on-line study you can arrange with Stanislaus ARES to take the ARRL test. We generally give the test at a ham cram session or before or after the monthly ARES meeting. Please e-mail Pat KG6JXZ at kg6jxz@charter.net, or Lucian KF6NPG at kf6npg@aol.com or John K6JRO at k6jro@arrl.net to arrange to take the test. *There is a \$15.00 test administration fee payable to ARRL.*

You can also access the updated ARRL EC-001 course at the ARRL website. Go to www.arrl.org. Once there click on the licensing, education and training tab. Then click on the



online course catalog tab and look for the EC-001 course. It states that it takes about 45 hours to complete the course over 9 weeks. Once you complete the ARRL course you can take the exam online. From what I can see there is no charge to take the course or exam. You have to take the course before you can take the exam.

You cannot take the challenge exam online.

Featured Article

Field Day 2021 by John Otte, K6JRO

Field Day is an annual amateur radio event held on the fourth full weekend of June, beginning at 18:00 UTC Saturday and running through 20:59 UTC Sunday. The focus is to encourage emergency communications preparedness among amateur radio operators. It is typically the largest single emergency preparedness exercise in the country, with over 40,000 operators participating each year.

Hams are encouraged to set up temporary transmitting stations in public places to demonstrate ham radio's science, skill and service to our communities and our nation.

Field Day combines public service, emergency preparedness, community outreach, and technical skills all in a single event. Field Day has been an annual event since 1933 and remains the most popular event in ham radio.

The objective is to contact as many stations as possible on the 160, 80, 40, 20,15, and 10 Meter HF bands, as well as all bands 50 MHz and above, and to learn to operate in abnormal situations in less than optimal conditions. While the spirit of Field Day is emergency preparedness, it is also a contest and, as such, there are rules and guidelines.

The COVID-19 rules established in 2020 will continue for 2021:

Class D stations may work *all other* Field Day stations, including other Class D stations, for points. This year, however, Class D and Class E stations will be limited to 150 W PEP output.

An *aggregate* club score will be published — just as it was done last year. The aggregate score will be a sum of all individual entries that attributed their score to that of a specific club.

ARRL Field Day is one of the biggest events on the amateur radio calendar. Last summer, a record 10,213 entries were received.

"With the greater flexibility afforded by the rules waivers, individuals and groups will still be able to participate in Field Day, while still staying within any public health recommendations and/or requirements," Bourque said.

The preferred method of submitting entries after Field Day is via the web applet. The ARRL Field Day rules include instructions on how to submit entries, which must be submitted or postmarked by Tuesday, July 27, 2021.

Silent Key

Silent Key Al, WG6M:

Alvin Dionizio



November 3, 1930 - May 23, 2021 Modesto, California - Alvin (Al) was born in Turlock, CA to Alfred and Ella Dionizio and spent first five years on the family dairy farm near Hilmar, CA. His father moved the family to Modesto, CA to work for the City of Modesto in 1935.

Alvin attended schools in Modesto from elementary grades through high school, graduating from Modesto High School in 1948.

Alvin joined the U.S. Navy soon after graduation and was sent to Millington, TN for aviation technical

training. Upon completion of training, he was sent to NAS Alameda, CA for duty in 1949.

In October 1949 he married his high school sweetheart Betty Frick. A son Thomas Dionizio was born at Oak Knoll Naval Hospital in Oakland, CA in September 1950.

Alvin's enlistment was frozen for one year because of the Korean conflict, but he volunteered to stay for two years. in January 1952 he was transferred to NAS Barber's Point, Hawaii. His wife and son joined him there.

Alvin was honorably discharged in June 1953 at Treasure Island Naval Base. He spent several months in the Veterans Hospital in Oakland, CA. His wife gave birth to their daughter Ann Dionizio in December 1953.

In 1954 Alvin started college on the G.I. Bill at Modesto Junior College and received an A.A. Degree in 1956. He then attended College of the Pacific in Stockton, CA and received a B.A. Degree in education with honors in 1958. He returned to Modesto where he taught school until 1987 when he retired.

Alvin and his wife enjoyed taking trips during the summer break from teaching. He was an amateur radio operator and member of the Stanislaus Amateur Radio Association. He enjoyed golfing, fishing and watching football on television. He belonged to several organizations including, Modesto Elks Lodge 1282, American Legion Post 74 Modesto, and E Clampus Vitus Chapter 58.

Alvin was preceded in death by his wife Betty, his parents and his sister Janet Humphrey.

He is survived by his children Thomas Dionizio (Carla) and Ann Benjamin (Paul), 2 grandchildren and 3 great-grandchildren.
