## From the desk of *The Readout* editor John Otte, K6JRO

Welcome to another edition of *The Readout*!

Russia's invasion of Ukraine has dominated the news cycle for the last two weeks. As you can imagine, this has had a profound effect on the amateur radio community in that region.

The ham community is a close tightknit community. I am sure that many of you have made contacts with other hams in the region. Unfortunately, they have been ordered to maintain radio silence. The American Radio Relay League (ARRL) is reporting:

Radio amateurs in Ukraine appear to be diligently maintaining radio silence as the state of emergency declared there just prior to the Russian military invasion remains in effect. A February 24 decree from President Volodymyr Zelensky included "a ban on the operation of amateur radio transmitters for personal and collective use." The Ukraine Amateur Radio League (UARL/LRU) reported this past week that it has received many messages of encouragement from the worldwide amateur radio community.

Furthermore, the International Amateur Radio Union (IARU) has adopted a "neutral stance," stating, "IARU is an apolitical organization focused on promoting and defending amateur radio and the amateur radio services... The amateur radio service is about self-instruction in communications and friendship between people." Presently, IARU Region 1 has said it continues to monitor the development and expects all radio amateurs "to follow their national laws and regulations."

## ARRL EC-001 Emergency Communications Course

If you need to take the ARRL Emergency Communications Course (EC-001) Stanislaus ARES can help. The EC-001 workbook is out of print, however The Indian River County ARES has all of the study information (including test and answers) posted on their web site. Recent amateurs who have taken the test have printed out the test questions and answers and have studied like they would for a ham cram. Pass rate has been about 100 percent.

\*\*\*The ARRL has updated this course. There are some content differences, however members who have used this to prepare for the challenge exam have been successful.\*\*\*

Here is the web site to study for the ARRL Introduction to Emergency Communications Course challenge examination (EC-001):

Go to [www.ircares.org](http://www.ircares.org) This is the web site for the Indian River County ARES. Once you are on the web site click on the training and reference tab. Then click on the ARRL Introduction to Emergency Communications (EC-001) tab. That will take you to the course information.

Once you complete this on-line study you can arrange with Stanislaus ARES to take the ARRL test. We generally give the test at a ham cram session or before or after the monthly ARES meeting. Please e-mail Lucian, KF6NPG at

kf6npg@aol.com or John, K6JRO at k6jro@arrl.net to arrange to take the test. ***There is a \$15.00 test administration fee payable to ARRL.***

You can also access the updated ARRL EC-001 course at the ARRL website. Go to [www.arrl.org](http://www.arrl.org). Once there click on the licensing, education and training tab. Then click on the online course catalog tab and



look for the EC-001 course. It states that it takes about 45 hours to complete the course over 9 weeks. Once you complete the ARRL course you can take the exam online. From what I can see there is no charge to take the course or exam. You must take the course before you can take the exam.

You cannot take the challenge exam online.

## Featured Article: *Remote VE exams*

Have you ever studied for a ham radio test only to learn that the nearest exam location is many miles away? In addition, it won't take place for two months. And by then, you'll have forgotten everything you learned? What if I told you how to take your technician license, or any of the upgrade exams, within two to three days as of this writing, and do so right from your own home? Would you be interested?

I've been a volunteer examiner with the ARRL and W5YI for several decades, but now am one with the Anchorage Amateur Radio Volunteer Examiner Coordinator in Anchorage Alaska (KL7AA). A group of us volunteer our time with the VEC to administer these exams over the Internet and have the opportunity to do so twice a day, six days a week if we so desire. At this rate, we're administering exams at the rate of 4 per day; sometimes a class of 20 or more examinees on a Sunday. Cost? \$15.00 per session, a normal exam fee, and you can take as many tests as you want at each testing session for the same price.

You'll need:

1: A reliable Internet connection capable of two video feeds and one audio feed.

2: One computer with a web browser and web camera that allows us to view your head, face and shoulders clearly for the duration of the examination. This same computer must have a microphone that allows the VE team to hear all sounds within the testing environment. For some reason, iPads don't seem to work well in this scenario.

3: Another computer with a web camera. Most examinees use a cell phone, but an iPad or similar device will do just fine. This camera must be positioned to allow the VE team to see the examinee's hands, workspace, scratch paper and/or calculator, and the computer monitor that's being used to take the exam.

4: The exam computer must have ZOOM installed and in working order.



5: A quiet room to complete the exam. It must be free from distractions or interruptions. The examinee must be the only person in the room, and if these parameters are broken for any reason during the test, it will be terminated, and will have to be re-started.

6: You may use a simple calculator, memory must be erased, but that calculator cannot be on your cell phone or on your computer.

7: You may use one sheet of scratch paper.

One of the fun things about this testing procedure is if you're taking the test for the Technician License class, you'll have access to your new callsign at the top of the hour that same day. So if you complete your test at 10:45 AM, about 11:02 AM, you'll know what your new callsign is. It's listed on the FCC web site. If you're upgrading to General or Extra Class, you'll see your upgrade there with the same speed.

If you're interested in testing under this scenario, go to <https://kl7aa.org/remote-testing/>. The web site will provide additional information including a "Process Overview on Fully Remote Testing". Scroll down a bit, and the actual procedure, that is, what happens on test day, is described.

Good luck, and we hope to see you on the ham bands.
