President Zack, KI6KQO called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm and welcomed everyone. There were 33 members, and one guest, according to the sign-in sheet. Zack had everyone introduce themselves and then led the pledge of allegiance. It was noted that today is Roy's, KK6OQP birthday. Zack reported on the upcoming "Tulare Amateur Radio Club Rally of the Valley," Saturday, Oct. 21, from 7 AM to 5 PM. Zack recognized Skylar Brown, KO6AZI and thanked him for his work on repairing the 440 antenna. Skylar was presented with a club membership for the remainder of 2023 and all of 2024.

Zack stated that a Field Day Coordinator is still need and he emphasized the importance of this position.

Vice-President Mark, N6ARP reported that he and Scott, KN6RKY have filed for a 501©3 status for the club with the IRS. The fee of \$275 was covered by donations. The Square app for dues payments and donations is now on the club website. If a member pays in person, the cost is 2.6% plus \$0.30 per transaction, or \$0.88 per member fee. If the person pays online the cost is 2.9% plus \$0.30 per transaction, or \$1.17 per member. The costs to the club will be recovered by signing up two new members. Of course, dues and donations can still be made by check or cash.

Mark has made a link to possible presentation topics on the website. Presentations are encouraged.

Reading of Minutes: Secretary Scott, N6CIC

Secretary Scott, N6CIC reported the Readout with the minutes that had been e-mailed out to the membership prior to the meeting. It was noted by Scott, KN6OOV that the date of Pacificon in the Readout of October 13-15 is incorrect. The correct date is October 20-22. Sergeant at Arms Vicki, KJ6RCV

Vicki said there were cookies and water available during the break. She said there would be a 50/50 split of the pot for tonight's meeting during the break.

Board Members: Bobby, KN6SDD, Randy, KF6RJS, Richard, W8AAL, and Jason, KA6TIO were present: They had no reports.

Equipment/Mt Oso: Club Trustee Leroy, NV6S has resigned pending approval of a new trustee (see New Business below). Club Technician Patrick, KG6AZZ was present.

Lucian, KF6NPG reported the repeater equipment is working well. He spent last Saturday (Oct. 14) at the Mt. Oso site with Elias, KN6GZW, his dad Jason, KN6HAG, and a group of Boy Scouts and friends working on the repeater shack. The budget was \$500 and actual costs were \$607, which has been covered by the club through donations.

The next project will be the back-up solar installation.

ARES: Paul, W6UHF: no report.

Community Events: Lucian, KF6NPG reported on the California Great Shakeout scheduled for Oct. 19 at 10:19 Pacific Time. There will be a voice net for check-ins and reports, or you can report via Winlink by first contacting Lucian.

Further Reports: Mark, N6ARP proposed a general Question and Answer session as part of the meeting agenda. This would enable members to ask questions that could be answered by experts in the club. He also mentioned that the ARES website has an "Ask Elmer" section for members to get answers to questions.

Richard, WE6V asked if we need to keep the FCC mandated RF exposure report. There is a link on the SARA website with more information.

Break:

There was a 15-minute break. The Split-the-Pot raffle raised \$120. Brent, KJ6MRJ was the lucky winner, and he took home \$60. Eva, KM6BIP served birthday cake in honor of Roy, KK6OQP.

Presentation: Lucian, KF6NPG gave a presentation on the upgrade of the repeater shack foundation by Elias, KN6GZW and the Boy Scouts. Lucian showed step-by-step slides of the project. He noted that the new posts were pressure treated wood on piers. Structural plywood was then added to cover the bottom structure to increase its strength. Elias, KN6GZW then presented his own slides of the project.

The presentation was very well received by club members, and in appreciation, Lucian presented a ham station to Elias and Jason donated by the family of Russ Richards, N6JTA silent key. Russ was the retired Fire Warden for Stanislaus County and a long-time member of SARA and Stanislaus ARES. Details of the Icom ham station are attached.

New Business: Zack, KI6KQO requested nominations for the position of Club Trustee following the resignation of Leroy, NV6S. Scott, N6CIC nominated Lucian, KF6NPG. Meeting Adjourned: Eva, KM6BIP made a motion to adjourn, and John, W6PY seconded. Zack adjourned the meeting at 8:05 PM. ARRL EC-001 course

ARRL EC-001 Emergency Communications Course

If you need to take the ARRL Emergency Communications Course (EC-001) Stanislaus ARES can help. The EC-001 workbook is out of print, however The Indian River County ARES has all of the study information (including test and answers) posted on their web site. Recent amateurs who have taken the test have printed out the test questions and answers and have studied like they would for a ham cram. Pass rate has been about 100 percent.

The ARRL has updated this course. There are some content differences, however members who have used this to prepare for the challenge exam have been successful.

Here is the web site to study for the ARRL Introduction to Emergency Communications Course challenge examination (EC-001):

Go to www.ircares.org This is the web site for the Indian River County ARES. Once you are on the web site click on the training and reference tab. Then click on the ARRL Introduction to Emergency Communications (EC-001) tab. That will take you to the course information.

Once you complete this on-line study you can arrange with Stanislaus ARES to take the ARRL test. We generally give the test at a ham cram session or before or after the monthly ARES meeting. Please e-mail Lucian, KF6NPG at kf6npg@aol.com or John, K6JRO at k6jro@arrl.net to arrange to take the test. **There is a \$15.00 test administration fee payable to ARRL.**

You can also access the updated ARRL EC-001 course at the ARRL website. Go to www.arrl.org. Once there click on the licensing, education and training tab. Then click on the online course catalog tab and



look for the EC-001 course. It states that it takes about 45 hours to complete the course over 9 weeks. Once you complete the ARRL course you can take the exam online. From what I can see there is no charge to take the course or exam. You must take the course before you can take the exam.

You cannot take the challenge exam online.
