President Zack, KI6KQO, called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm, welcomed everyone and led the Pledge of Allegiance. There were 30 members present and one guest according to the sign-in sheet. Following introductions, Zack reported that we would have the Zoom presentation by Dr. Ed Fong first on the agenda.

Presentation Dr. Ed Fong, WB6IQN: Mark, N6ARP, introduced Dr. Fong who has 12 patents and over 40 publications and is currently an instructor at UC Santa Cruz in RF design and other topics. His J-pole antenna designs for ham and commercial use have been extraordinarily successful. Advantages of the J-pole are it requires no radials, is end-fed, has an ideal dipole radiation pattern, and a lightning arrestor is not needed. He has dual-band VHF-UHF designs for sale in either a PVC pipe version or a rollup version, and he now has a tri-band design for 2 meters, 220 MHz, and 70 cm. He encouraged members to send in a group order to receive a price discount on the antennas. Zack agreed to be the point person for the group order. His research group also has a brand new Yaesu FT991 complete with power supply and speaker for \$800 if anyone has an interest.

President Zack, KI6KQO, reported that the next all-mode net will be on Thursday, March 7, at 7:00 PM on the topics of repeaters and their proper use. Coming up on April 27th is the 2nd Annual Stan-Joaquin Picnic and Swap Meet in Manteca. Thanks to Bill, AE6J, for donating a radio for tonight's raffle.

Vice-President Mark, N6ARP, showed a slide on dues payment and how important club dues are to cover our operating costs.

There were no additions or corrections and Lucian, KF6NPG, made a motion to approve the minutes, with a second by Scott, KN6OOV. The club approved the minutes unanimously.

Treasurer Scott, KN6RKY, read the current treasurer's report. A copy is attached to the minutes and will be included in the next Readout. PG&E has significantly raised their rates, which is impacting on our operating costs. Bill, AE6J, made a motion to accept the report. After a second by Dick, W8AAL, the club approved the treasurer's report.

Sergeant at Arms Herb, W9CMX had no report. He had snacks, water, and coffee available for the break.

Board Members: Randy, KF6RJS, Dick, W8AAL, Bobby, KN6SDD, and Jason, KA6TIO, were present: Dick, W8AAL, reported he had someone who could help do antenna installations, and Randy, KF6RJS, gave an update on the weather.

Club Trustee Lucian, KF6NPG, reported the recent storm caused a 3-day power outage on Mt. Oso. The backup battery worked for 27 hours before shutting down the repeater. The Repeater Committee is looking at the possibility of purchasing a 200 Amp Hour battery that would get through a three- or four-day power outage. The present Battleborn battery would then be switched to the UHF repeater. The committee continues to explore options for solar back-up. Prices on the LiFePO4 batteries have come down.

The Mt. Oso property owner notified us that the road is quite rough from the storm, and we should delay a trip until repairs have been made. Some of the turn buckles on the on-ground guy wires appear to have come loose. The next trip is scheduled for April 10, but we may go sooner if the road is repaired.

ARES: Ed, KF6FIR, reported the next meeting will be on Saturday, March 9. Discussion items will be Winlink and deploying Buddipole antennas. He advised keeping batteries charged in case of a call-out for deployment to the field.

ARRL EC-001 Emergency Communications Course

ARRL EC-001 course

If you need to take the ARRL Emergency Communications Course (EC-001) Stanislaus ARES can help. The EC-001 workbook is out of print, however The Indian River County ARES has all of the study information (including test and answers) posted on their web site. Recent amateurs who have taken the test have printed out the test questions and answers and have studied like they would for a ham cram. Pass rate has been about 100 percent.

The ARRL has updated this course. There are some content differences, however members who have used this to prepare for the challenge exam have been successful.

Here is the web site to study for the ARRL Introduction to Emergency Communications Course challenge examination (EC-001):

Go to www.ircares.org This is the web site for the Indian River County ARES. Once you are on the web site click on the training and reference tab. Then click on the ARRL Introduction to Emergency Communications (EC-001) tab. That will take you to the course information.

Once you complete this on-line study you can arrange with Stanislaus ARES to take the ARRL test. We generally give the test at a ham cram session or before or after the monthly ARES meeting. Please e-mail Lucian, KF6NPG at kf6npg@aol.com or John, K6JRO at k6jro@arrl.net to arrange to take the test. **There is a \$15.00 test administration fee payable to ARRL**.

You can also access the updated ARRL EC-001 course at the ARRL website. Go to www.arrl.org. Once there click on the licensing, education and training tab. Then click on the online course catalog tab and



look for the EC-001 course. It states that it takes about 45 hours to complete the course over 9 weeks. Once you complete the ARRL course you can take the exam online. From what I can see there is no charge to take the course or exam. You must take the course before you can take the exam.

You cannot take the challenge exam online.
