


#### - - SUDDENLY

#### MARCH MEETING




#### AMATUER RADIO CALLS

#### FOUR VE'S DISACREDITED

ARRI /VEC has of its accredited four Volunteer Examiners owing to apparent testing "irregularities" at two sessions conducted by the four VEs. A1 though only three accredited VEs are needed to conduct this VE Team session. used one VF to serve "liaison" between the ARRL/ VEC office and the team was directly responsible for security of the the materials. The other three VEs administered the exams. problems surfaced when VEC staffers noted that some had not exam papers returned by the VE team required. FM radio broadcast A new noise suppressing technique developed by the CBS Technology Center in Stamford. Connecticut, improves sound quality and has the side benefit of tripling the station's area of coverage! It's called. FMX- for Extended Range FM. The FCC Zenith's technology chose back when FM stereo introduced rather than the superior audio quality of the Crosby system since the latter method was not compatible with the mono-only FM receivers then in use. Under the Zenith method. sounds quieter than the noise level are amplified so that they can be heard. High pitched sounds heard through "pre-emphasis", equivalent to turning up the treble control. The result is subtle distortion. The transmitted music is robbed of its intricate dynamics and high frequency overtones, sounds that available in today's wide range, vivid recordings, particularly digitized CD's

(compact discs). The bio advantage of FMX is that is that it is fully compatible nation's 100-milwith the lion FM radios. "Noise" is drastically reduced. radio receivers equipped to take advantage of the encoded FMX. Several broadcasters are experimenting with FMX and as many as 100 stations could begin FMX broadcasting this year after installing the \$5,000 FMX stereo generator. It will take a while, however, for consumers to receive FMX. Receiver manufacturers are awaiting the availability of an FMX decoder on a single microchip but Japanese makers are already tooling up. There is at least one disadvantage. FMX permits reception further from the transmitter and multipath interference (bouncing signals that partially cancel each other) is necessarily increased.

#### SURVIVALIST MAGAZINE RECOMMENDS ICOM IC-2AT'S

The ICOM IC-2AT's noise free FM and rupped sophistication make it a perfect choice for portable tactical communications." This is part of what the January 1987 American Survival Guide magazine had to say in a two page article on tactical communications. Although it stated that the 2-AT operates in the Amateur 2 meter band and that a li-

cense was needed to transmit on those frequencies, it quick to point out that it operates on almost 1700 frequencies from 141.500 149.995 MHz. and that in emergency it can be used by an unlicensed person in the Amateur band. The article also points out that frequencies above and below the Amateur 2 meter band are assigned mostly to the military but issues no warning about operating there. sure the ICOM people glad to get the publicity but the potential for trusion of unlicensed operators into the Amateur band is highly likely.

#### PIRATE RADIO STATION -"LASER 558"- BACK ON THE AIR

"Laser 558". the British pirate radio station. is back on the air. The station broadcasts illegally to Britain from a ship anchored in international waters off Britain's east coast. The station was forced off the air during a storm more than a year ago and towed into port by a surveillance vessel of the British DTI (Department of

Trade and Industry- similar to our FCC). The DTI had blockaded the vessel and once towed into port, the American DJ's were kicked of the country. out station is now operating on kHZ at anchor 17 miles off the coast of Essex one mile away from another pirate ship. Radio Caroline that has been on the air for over 20 years.
