Reading of Minutes: Secretary Scott, N6CIC, said the minutes from last month's meeting were presented in the READOUT sent out prior to the meeting. There were two corrections to the minutes. Eva, KM6BIP, was present only once, not twice and Robin, KG6ZYQ, did not bring refreshments. Thanks, ladies, for your careful reading of the minutes. With these corrections, Greg, KO6GJL, made a motion to approve the minutes, and with a second by Eva, KM6BIP, the club approved the minutes unanimously.

Treasurer Scott, KN6RKY, reported we have an ending July bank balance of \$11,313.67. The Treasurer's report ends on the last day of the month, so it was available for review in the Readout. Lucian, KF6NPG, made a motion to approve the report, and with a second by Cathy, KO6LST, the club voted to approve the report.

President John, K6JRO, reminded club members that elections for club officers and the board are coming up and encouraged members to consider if they would like to hold an office or be on the board.

Vice-President Brian, KN6QFF, reported that Lucian would give a presentation on the History of the SARA Club today. Brian said he would give a presentation on 3D printing in September.

Sergeant at Arms Robin, KG6ZYQ, said There will be a 50:50 raffle at the break. She brought water, Alex, KO6HPZ, brought dessert bars, and Eva, KM6BIP, brought a cake to celebrate her 24th wedding anniversary with Roy, KK6OQP. Congratulations to you both! Greg, KO6GJL, brought notebooks, and an Amazon watt meter holder for Harbor Freight Apache boxes, free for the taking.

Club Trustee Lucian, KF6NPG, gave the following Repeater Committee Report.

- 440 and GMRS seem to be working well, with no reported issues.
- New 6-meter repeater is ready for installation on next trip. The old repeater is working intermittently.
- The 220-repeater is up and running.

Both the new 6-meter and 220 repeaters were no cost to the club. The 6-meter radios were from an ARES grant, I bought the rack mount and Patrick made the cables. One 220 radio was from an ARES grant, and I bought the second radio and the rack mount. Patrick made the cables.

The “Beep-Beep” sound comes and goes. We are still investigating the cause. Remote monitor for solar is working well. The A/C keeps temps to mid-80’s or lower. I took off the repeater cabinet doors facing the A/C and that helps to lower the equipment temperature.

The downtown Kenwood 145.110 repeater is back up and running with no issues reported.

Trips were made to Mt. Oso on Sunday August 9, 2026, and Wednesday August 12, 2026. The following work was done:

- Checked tower and all looked good.
- Alex KO6HPZ installed the meshtastic. He said that it seemed to be working well. To date 133 miles direct connection has been made.
- Checked Mesh and it seemed to be working well. Consistent solar remote reports. New Dish is here for Ed Mesh to enhance signal from Ed’s house to Oso for the tunnel. Ed will be picking up and installing it.
- Cleaned building and refilled the rodent bait.
- On the 12th I did some more cleaning and removed a microphone from the 220-repeater. It was causing some static. Also checked the digipeater equipment at the BOR (Bureau of Reclamation building).

We will be making a trip up to the repeater site on Saturday August 29, 2026.

- Install a plug for battery charging when there is no solar and we are on PG&E.
- Check Verizon wireless modem, check mesh, connect new 6-meter repeater, and clean out some old equipment.
- Will begin work to install battery backup at the digipeater site.

Note: thanks to the Repeater Committee members for their dedicated work keeping the club’s repeaters in excellent condition.

Board Members: Mark, N6ARP, Cheryl, KK6GJM, Dick, W8AAL, and Scott, KN6OOV, were present. Mark, N6ARP, reported that a hamcram was held last week with four participants and they all passed.

Congratulations to Elmer and Michael Moreira, who both passed their Technician Exams and are present as guests here today!

ARES: Wally, KK6CPN, stated that Lucian, KF6NPG, gave a presentation on Winlink mapping and AZZ packet mapping. The Walk to Prevent Alzheimer's is on September 19 starting at 9:00 AM. Also on September 19, ARES will have an information booth on the campus of Stanislaus State as part of Stanislaus County OES Preparedness Day. Greg, KO6GJL, and Wally, KK6CPN, will be at the booth 10:00 AM-2:00 PM and you are welcome to drop by.

Events: Lucian, KF6CPN, reported that Ed, KF6FIR, received the ARRL Worked All States award in FT8 mode. Pacifcon is coming on October 16-18, and in 2028 the ARRL National Convention will be held at the Pacifcon location.

Weather Officer Randy, KF6RJS, reported the current temperature is 91.0 degrees with a high today of 94.3 degrees, The high tomorrow will be 97 degrees and expected highs for the remainder of the week are in the 88-to-94-degree range.

Preparedness is everyone's responsibility, and disasters and emergencies can happen at any time, anywhere, and sometimes without warning.

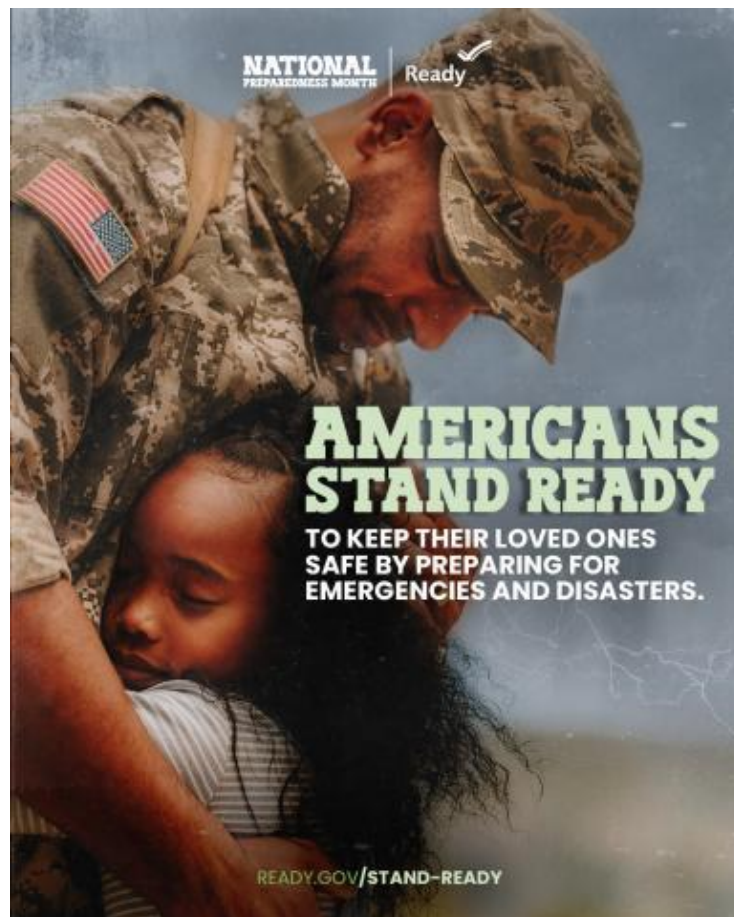
This year's theme will focus on several distinct ideas that capture how Americans take pride in their ability to protect themselves and their families and work together to recover from disasters:

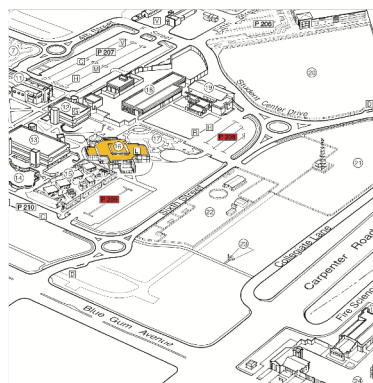

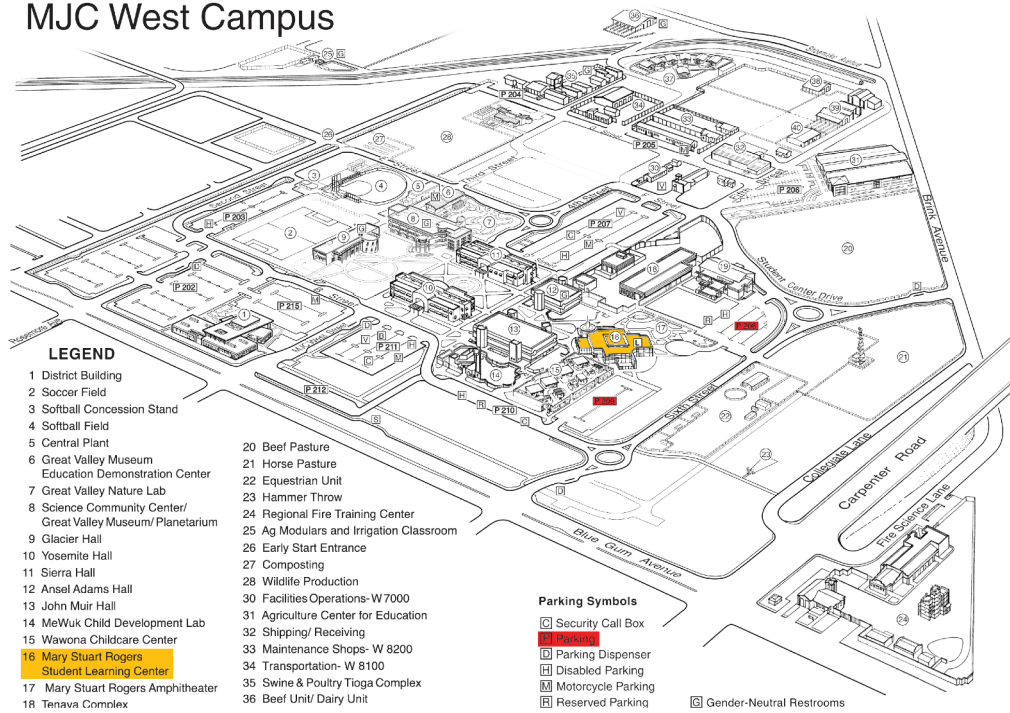
